Re: Notice of Intent to Sue Under the Mississippi Tort Claims Act

Dear City Clerk:

This letter serves as formal notice under the Mississippi Tort Claims Act (Miss. Code Ann. § 11-46-1 et seq.) of my intent to file a lawsuit against the City of Ocean Springs and specific city officials. The forthcoming lawsuit will include claims for violations of my rights under the Mississippi Public Records Act, as well as state tort law claims, including defamation and intentional infliction of emotional distress. Additionally, the lawsuit will include federal claims for violations of the First and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution, brought pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983, and will be filed in federal court.

The claims stem from a pattern of unconstitutional and retaliatory conduct by city officials who sought to punish me for exercising my constitutionally protected rights as a journalist. These actions include:

- 1. **Retaliation for Protected Speech**: Defendants engaged in intentional interference with my professional relationships and sought to silence my constitutionally protected reporting on matters of public concern.
- 2. **Obstructing Access to Public Records**: Defendants withheld or failed to provide critical public records, as evidenced by omissions in responses contradicted by records obtained from public records and third parties.
- 3. **Defamation**: False and defamatory statements were made publicly and privately, damaging my professional reputation actions taken as retaliation for accurate reporting of government affairs.

This notice is not merely about seeking redress for the harm I have endured but about protecting the rights of every resident and journalist in Ocean Springs. The First Amendment guarantees the right to free speech and the ability to redress grievances against the government. These rights are foundational to our democracy, yet the City of Ocean Springs has chosen to undermine them.

The residents of Ocean Springs deserve transparency and accountability from their elected officials, not a culture of secrecy and retaliation. Journalists play a critical role in shining a light on government misconduct, and any attempt to silence or intimidate them is an affront to the community's right to know.

I hope the city will use the 90-day notice period to reflect on the actions of its officials and consider steps to remedy the harm done. My hope is that this matter can be resolved in a way that restores trust and reaffirms the city's commitment to constitutional principles.

Should the city wish to discuss a resolution during this period, I am open to engaging in constructive dialogue. However, if no meaningful steps are taken, I intend to proceed with litigation to vindicate not only my rights but also the rights of all residents and journalists who demand accountability from their government.

This letter serves as formal notification that I intend to pursue litigation against the City of Ocean Springs. The forthcoming lawsuit will involve claims of First Amendment retaliation, violations of the Mississippi Public Records Act, defamation, and other causes of action stemming from the actions of city officials.

As such, the City of Ocean Springs and its officials are obligated to preserve all potentially relevant evidence in their possession, custody, or control. This obligation applies to physical documents, electronically stored information (ESI), and any other materials that may relate to this matter.

Scope of Preservation

• Public or private posts, comments, or messages referencing Plaintiff or his work on platforms used by city officials.

6. Meeting Records:

• Agendas, minutes, recordings, or notes from public or executive sessions that address issues involving Plaintiff or broader media relations.

7. Other Relevant Records:

• Documentation or communications involving other journalists, residents, or stakeholders who may have been subject to similar treatment as Plaintiff, to support Plaintiff's Monell claim.

Additional Instructions

- Suspension of Routine Deletion Policies: Immediately suspend any routine deletion, overwriting, or destruction policies (e.g., email purging, phone resets) to ensure no loss of relevant evidence.
- Third-Party Custodians: Ensure preservation efforts extend to third-party vendors or service providers who may possess relevant records (e.g., IT service providers, social media platforms).
- **Broader Scope for Monell Evidence:** Preserve any documentation or communications that demonstrate or could demonstrate a custom, policy, or practice of retaliation, obstruction, or other constitutional violations by the City of Ocean Springs.
